his spring, Robroy Industries, Verona, participated in the Education Partnership's Adopt-A-School Program. Headquarters chose to adopt Pittsburgh Spring Hill K-5, a Title I school located in the North Side of Pittsburgh. This decision was made after hearing about the educational needs of its students from Kathleen Liberto, Jean Liberto's daughter, and Danelle Uniatowki. Ms. Liberto serves as a Speech-Language Pathologist at the school and Ms. Uniatowki is a fourth grade math teacher there.

Children in low-income schools, such as Spring Hill, face special challenges. Most of the students attending Spring Hill K-5 do not have the supplies at home to finish homework assignments, such as pencils, crayons and paper. The lack of resources puts these children and their teachers at a very large disadvantage for educational success.

Browse with Care

A nother favorite trick of cybercriminals is **poisoned search results or black hat SEO (search engine optimization)**. Malware writers use your curiosity and exploit high-profile events like a celebrity scandal, new tech gadgets or major events like the Olympics, a royal birth, an election or sports championships to draw your attention. Cybercriminals know what people are searching for online and talking about via social media and they use that against us. While search engines like Google are very good at protecting from these threats, cybercriminals quickly stand up entire websites within hours of sensational news breaking, claiming video and pictures, but only delivering malware to visitors. It may take Google a few hours to identify and remove these sites from its search results, but in that time plenty of users can be infected.

Tip: Get your celebrity gossip and news from trusted sites only. Always be careful what you're searching for and what sites you visit on your lunch hour. Don't assume you're protected because work has better security than your home PC. Threats – especially newly created threats – can still slip through.
