Family Forum



TIPS FROM IT

Avoid Weak Passwords

The most common password is 123456, followed by 123456789 and "password." Some people use their name or that of a pet. If you are guilty of using any of these common passwords consider changing them now. Hackers use passwords to access information, so do not make it easy for them.

Do you write your passwords down where someone may have access to them? Do you store them in email or other digital files? Instead, store them in a password manager. Third party programs are available and one is built into Windows 10. These programs store passwords and can automatically populate them when required.

Whether you use a password manager or not, a strong password is critical. It should be something you will remember and the longer the better. A strong password is at least eight characters in length. Additional recommendations follow:

- Use a combination of numbers and upper and lowercase letters and special characters.
- No personal information should be used, such as street addresses, birthdays, children or pet names.
- Use something familiar, but not obvious.
- Change your passwords periodically.

It is best practice to change your passwords periodically (Robroy forces you to change network passwords every 180 days) — not only your Windows 10 password, but any passwords you use for other applications and services.

To change your password in Windows 10 (If you normally work using a VPN, make sure you're connected to the network first):

- Press **CTRL+Alt+Del** on your keyboard
- Select the option to Change Password
- Supply your existing password and a new one of your choice (twice)







Apricot Grand Marnier Bread Pudding

Lots of work and lots of calories, but a truly delicious holiday treat.

Serves 12
Preheat oven to 350°
9 x 13 x 2 glass baking dish - spray with Pam

Bring to a boil, then cool completely:

- 1 cup Gran Marnier or Triple Sec
- ¼ cup water

Wisk into the above mixture:

- 5 cups HEAVY whipping cream
- 6 large eggs
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 tbs vanilla
- 1 tsp nutmeg
- 1 tsp cinnamon

Spread on the bottom of the glass baking dish:

- 1 cup diced dried apricots
- 1 # loaf of Italian bread (soft not crusty) cut into ½" cubes

Pour liquid over bread making sure that all the bread is wet, allow to sit for 20 minutes, then cover with foil.

Place pan of bread pudding into another 2" deep pan containing HOT water, so that the water rises 1" up the side of the bread pudding pan.

Bake 1 hour then remove foil and continue to bake for 30 minutes until golden brown and firm.

Before serving:

- Cut the bread pudding into 3 x 3 squares
- Place one square upside down on a microwavable plate
- Microwave for 40 seconds
- Drizzle caramel over warm bread pudding
