Air tempering differs from air conditioning in that the system is designed to reduce the temperature inside the facility relative to the outside air temperature. There are multiple benefits to air tempering. One is equipment sizing - here you can do more with less, as you're not trying to maintain a set temperature, you're only trying to cut the heat a bit.
