





Unacceptable Delays

Multiple miscellaneous delays on the AED Threader Line started adding up over the course of a 24 hour period. The maintenance team became involved and began scheduling down the work-cell for maintenance purposes. This occurred one day per week and the reliability of the equipment improved. Once the delays began to decrease, the team (operators,

maintenance techs and supervisors) started their investigation at the beginning of the line and worked their way to the end.

First, it was observed that the conduit loading lacked consistency, so the kick-over arms were fine-tuned to allow additional settling time into the conveyor. Once the conduit loaded onto the conveyor, the hold down arms did not engage soon enough causing a feed delay into the grinder cabinet. The timing was adjusted. Next, the team found 17 seconds lost between cuts inside the saw cabinet, starving the threader. The time was decreased and now the threader never waits for product. Done!

Not so fast. The exit table, which holds the threaded conduit, filled to capacity stopping the processing of additional pipe. This resulted because the pipe still contained threader coolant inside the conduit. A single blower could not remove the coolant quickly enough. The addition of two blowers alleviated the bottleneck.

A combined effort identified the problems and the team worked together to make the necessary adjustments. The AED Treader Line now works very efficiently.






Go Lions!

RECIPES



Uncle Bob's Chili

Ruth Forester's husband's recipe

Ingredients

2.5 lbs. coarse ground beef or

1 lbs.each of venison, elk and antelope

2 bell peppers diced

1 large onion diced

1 15 oz. can black beans drained and rinsed

1 15 oz. can red beans drained and rinsed

1 15 oz. can diced tomatoes

½ cup chili powder

1 tbs. garlic powder

1 tbs. black pepper

1 tbs. cayenne pepper more or less to taste

1 tsp. salt

Combine ingredients and pour evenly over stuffing. Then layer the other half of the stuffing over turkey mixture.

Spread a can of cream of chicken soup over the stuffing, evenly. Bake for 35 minutes at 325°. Remove from oven and add grated cheddar cheese on top of the casserole (enough to make a thin layer). Return to the oven for an additional 10 minutes, then serve.
