



According to a report from CNN, pickleball has exploded on the scene since the start of the pandemic. According to Sports and Fitness Industry Association, pickleball has grown from 3.5 million players in 2019 to 8.9 million in 2022. The number of players is expected to jump to 22 million in 2023.

Great Texas Balloon Race



The Raceway Division sponsored a hot air balloon in the GTBR in memory of Larry Aldridge.*

In 1978, the Great Texas Balloon Race (GTBR) was born from an agreement between Dr. Bill Bussey, D.D.S., a world-record holding hot air balloon pilot, Frankie Parson Riggins and Mary LeTourneau, Longview Mall managers. The agreement was an attempt to advertise the mall's opening. Dr. Bussey draped a Longview Mall banner on his hot air balloon and flew over the city of Longview.

Two years later, Bill Stoudt and the Stroh Brewery Company joined forces with the Longview Mall and the first-ever Balloon Glow was held on the mall's south parking lot. Along with other pilots, Dr. Bussey created an evening attraction designed to delight the crowds. Tethered balloons were illuminated setting off a spectacular display of light. The first-ever Balloon Glow became an instant success and is held annually on both Friday and Saturday evenings of the GTBR. Whatever modifications have been made at balloon events around the world, know that this crowd-pleasing event began in Longview, Texas.

In 1985, due to ever-increasing attendance, the launch site was moved to the Stroh Brewery complex. From 1987-1989, the race was not held. But when it returned in 1990, with the support of Gordon Lively of Lively Oldsmobile-Cadillac-GMC, the race was moved to the East Texas Regional Airport south of Longview and is still home of the race today.

The most exciting race is known by pilots as the Controlled Navigational Trajectory Event (CNTE). For years the "Ring Toss" was the GTBR's CNTE. Each pilot had only one chance in each race to steer their balloon toward a 12-inch ring atop a 20-foot pole. In 2012, the pole was successfully ringed nine times by competitors. The "Ring Toss" has been replaced by "Ducks on a Pond," in which the pilots pass over a boat in the target field and toss a rubber ducky into the boat.

The GTBR is a Balloon Federation of America event and was hosted by the United States National Championship competition from 2012-2015. For these four years, the national competition brought an additional three days of competition flights to the East Texas area. Outside of national competition years, the GTBR invites 50 sport and special-shaped hot air balloons. The pilots compete for the Texas State Championship.

Robroy sponsored a hot air balloon and pilot at this year's GTBR, June 12th - 18th. The event drew competitors from around the world to Longview, Texas, the balloon capital of Texas. The beauty and elegance of these balloons is just amazing.

*Larry Aldridge passed away on June 1, 2023. He was involved with the GTBR for decades as the Operations Director.


ATD Conference



Additionally, Ella has been chosen to take part in the Robroy Enclosures part-time summer intern program.







RECIPE



Broccoli, Grape and Pasta Salad

If you are a broccoli fan, you'll love the combination of these colorful ingredients. Cook the pasta al dente so it's firm enough to hold its own when tossed with the tangy-sweet dressing.

- 1 cup chopped pecans
- ½ of a 16oz package of farfalle (bowtie) pasta
- 1 lb fresh broccoli
- 1 cup mayonnaise or Miracle Whip
- 1/3 cup sugar
- 1/3 cup diced red onion
- 1/3 cup red wine vinegar
- 1 tsp salt
- 2 cups seedless red grapes halved
- 8 slices cooked bacon crumbled

Preheat oven to 350. Bake pecans in a single layer in a shallow pan 5 to 7 minutes or until lightly toasted and fragrant, stirring halfway through.

Prepare pasta according to package directions.

Cut broccoli florets from stems and separate into small pieces using the tip of a paring knife. Peel away tough outer layer of stems and finely chop stems.

Whisk together mayonnaise and next 4 ingredients in a large bowl; add broccoli, hot cooked pasta and grapes, then stir to coat.

Cover and chill for 3 hours.

Stir bacon and pecans into the salad just before serving.


